

Each institution, conforming to the admission requirements of the host institution, will nominate students to study at the partner university. Students are required to meet the language proficiency requirements of the host institution. Exchange students at King's are required to demonstrate a TOEFL IBT score of 80 or above or an IELTS score of 6.0 or above. Other English proficiency tests may be considered if requested. The home institution shall assume responsibility in the nomination of qualified candidates.

Each institution will accept 1 or 2 students per academic year. Students can attend the partner institution for one semester (fall/winter) or for a full academic year (from September until April). These numbers will be reviewed every several years in order to insure parity.

Participating students shall be subjected to the rules and regulations of the host university. They will also have the rights and privileges enjoyed by the students in the host university.

All exchange students shall be subject to the same academic regulations and class performance expectations as pertain to the regularly enrolled students at the receiving institution.

Exchange students at King's are not permitted to register in the professional courses in the School of Social Work, both in the BSW (Undergraduate) and MSW (Graduate) programs. Due to the high demand of courses in some departments, some courses may not be available to exchange students particularly in the School of Management, Economics and Mathematics and the Department of Psychology.

The tuition fees for the students during the fall/winter term/s will be waived by King's and Yeditepe. Each exchange student participant will be responsible for his/her own transportation to and from the host institution. It is mandatory for each participant to stay in student residence at King's. Students shall pay residence/housing fees, mandatory health insurance and other required fees to his/her exchange institution. Students who visit King's must also register and attend the International Students' Bridging Program at the start of the Fall or Winter academic term
